# Glossary

Candle: Hebrew: *Ner*; there are eight candles on the Chanukah *menorah* not including the helper candle, the *shamash*.

Card: A decorative card sent to convey good wishes.

Cookies: Delicious and fun to eat, cookies are a Hanukkah favorite.

Dove: A bird symbolizing peace.

*Dreidel*: Spinning top marked with the Hebrew letters *nun*, *gimmel*, *hey* and *shin*, an acronym for *Nes Gadol Hayah Sham*, “a great miracle happened there.”

Eight: There are eight nights of Chanukah.

*Gelt*: Literally “money”- monetary gifts given on Chanukah.

Gifts: Gifts are given during Hanukkah with affection.

*Gimel*: A letter in the Hebrew alphabet; on the dreidle it stands for *Gadol* (big/great).

*Chanukiyah*: The nine branched *menorah* used during Chanukah.

*Hey*: A letter in the Hebrew alphabet; on the dreidel it stands for *Haya* (happened).

*Kislev*: The Jewish month corresponding to November - December when Chanukah occurs.

Lighting the *menorah*: Candles are lit each night of Chanukah.

*Latkes*: Fried potato pancakes, traditionally served on Chanukah.

Maccabee: The Jewish army that revolted against the Syrian-Greek occupation in 139 BCE, whose miraculous victory culminated in the festival of Chanukah.

*Maoz Tzur*: Rock of Ages; a traditional Chanukah song.

*Menorah*: The seven-branched gold candelabra in the Temple, also refers to the nine-branched *Chanukiyah* kindled on Chanukah commemorating the holiday miracle.

*Nun*: A letter in the Hebrew alphabet; on the *dreidel* it stands for *Nes* (miracle).

Oil: One of the miracles of Chanukah is that the oil lasted for eight days. As a result, it is traditional to eat foods fried in oil.

Olives: The oil that burned in the Temple in Jerusalem came from olives.

PJ Library Book: A book that can help you learn more about Chanukah!

Playing Dreidel: A game with a four-sided top traditionally played on Chanukah.

Potatoes: An ingredient in potato pancakes (*latkes*) traditionally eaten on Chanukah.

*Shamash*: The helper candle that lights the other candles. It is taller (or separate) than the other candles.

*Shin*: A letter in the Hebrew alphabet; on the dreidel it stands for *Sham* (there).

Star of David: The *Magen David*, a modern symbol of Jewish identity.

*Sufganiot*: Fried donuts, often filled with jelly, a traditional Chanukah food.

Temple: The central religious building for the Jewish people in Jerusalem that was destroyed by the Syrian-Greeks in the Chanukah story.
